ISRAEL'S TURMOIL VS. JUDAH'S STABILITY (2 Kings 15:27-38)

- I. The Reign of Pekah in ISRAEL (2 Kings 15:27-31)
 - A. CLAIMED the throne by ASSASSINATION
 - B. CONTINUED in the sins of JEROBOAM I
 - C. Ruled for TWENTY YEARS
 - 1. Lost GILEAD and GALILEE to Assyria
 - 2. ASSASSINATED by Hoshea, who then claimed the throne
- II. The Reign of Jotham in JUDAH (2 Kings 15:32-38; 2 Chron. 27:1-9)
 - A. The SETTING of His Reign (2 Kings 15:32-33)
 - 1. Ascended in the SECOND year of PEKAH
 - 2. INHERITED the throne from his father UZZIAH
 - 3. MOTHER was Jerusha, daughter of Zadok
 - 4. Ascended at age 25 and ruled for 16 years
 - B. The CHARACTER of His Reign (2 Kings 15:34-35a; 2 Chron. 27:2)
 - 1. He did what was RIGHT in GOD'S eyes
 - 2. Not as GOOD as DAVID, but BETTER than his FATHER
 - 3. The "HIGH PLACES" were not REMOVED

- C. The EVENTS of His Reign (2 Kings 35b-38; 2 Chron. 27:3-9)
 - 1. He built the UPPER GATE of "the HOUSE of the LORD"
 - 2. He did EXTENSIVE work on the WALL at Ophel
 - 3. He built NEW TOWNS in the Judean hills
 - 4. He built FORTRESSES and TOWERS in the woodlands
 - 5. He DEFEATED the Ammonites and put them under TRIBUTE for THREE YEARS
 - 6. He was HARASSED by the anti-Assyrian coalition of SYRIA and ISRAEL
 - 7. Jotham became MIGHTY because he OBEYED GOD

III. Lessons

- A. God often JUDGES the rebellious through the NATURAL CONSEQUENCES of their SIN
- B. While they remained FAITHFUL, God blessed His people with POLITICAL STABILITY
- C. God continues to be PATIENT with INCOMPLETE obedience, but He does not OVERLOOK it
