THE BLACK VELVET BACKDROP The Wrath of God (Romans 1:18)

- I. God's Wrath DENIED
 - A. Some consider it DISTASTEFUL
 - B. Some consider it ANTIQUATED
- II. God's Wrath DEFINED
 - A. God's FIERCE ANGER toward all that is CONTRARY to His HOLINESS
 - 1. He ABHORS ALL SIN
 - 2. He can TOLERATE NO SIN
 - 3. He must JUDGE ALL SIN
 - B. Without His wrath...
 - 1. God would be UNLOVING
 - 2. God would be UNJUST
 - 3. God would be UNHOLY
- III. God's Wrath DISPLAYED
 - A. His CATACLYSMIC Wrath
 - 1. In the UNIVERSAL FLOOD (Gen. 6:5-7, 17)

- 2. At SODOM and GOMORRAH (Gen. 19:13)
- 3. On the EGYPTIANS (Exod. 7:14-14:31)
- 4. On the CANAANITES (Josh. 6:21)
- B. His ABANDONMENT Wrath
 - 1. Removes RESTRAINTS against SIN
 - 2. Turns him over to his own SINFUL DESIRES
- C. His LAST DAYS Wrath
 - 1. Begins in the TRIBULATION
 - 2. Climaxes at ARMAGEDDON
- D. His ETERNAL Wrath
 - 1. Falls on SATAN, his DEMONS, and UNREDEEMED humanity
 - 2. Described as TORMENT for ETERNITY
- E. His REDEMPTIVE Wrath
 - 1. Christ is our SIN-BEARER and our WRATH-BEARER
 - 2. Every sin will either be PARDONED in CHRIST forever or

PUNISHED in HELL forever

- IV. God's Wrath REALIZED—How should we RESPOND?
 - A. We should respond with TREMBLING (Heb. 10:31)
 - B. We should respond with TRUST (1 Thess. 1:10)
 - C. We should respond with THANKSGIVING (Ps. 103:1-3, 10)
