WHY I AM NOT A CATHOLIC

Part 2: False Gospel (Galatians 2:16-21)

I. BIBLICAL Doctrine of Justification

- A. Its meaning: to declare NOT GUILTY" or "to declare INNOCENT of ALL CHARGES" (the opposite of a verdict of "GUILTY as charged")
 - 1. In its technical or theological sense, it represents LEGAL status before GOD (Deut. 25:1; Isa. 5:23; Micah 6:11; Rom. 8:33-34)
 - 2. In its general, non-technical sense, it means "to be vindicated before OTHERS" (Gen. 44:16; Job 33:2, 32; Is. 43:9; Mt. 12:37; Lk. 10:29; 16:15; cf. Ps. 51:4; Lk. 7:29; Rom. 3:4)

B. Its application

- Just as "to CONDEMN" does not MAKE someone wicked, neither does "to JUSTIFY" necessarily MAKE someone righteous
- 2. None of the equivalent expressions in Scripture mean "to MAKE someone righteous"
 - a. "Transgression is FORGIVEN" (Ps. 32:1)
 - b. "Sin is COVERED" (Ps. 32:1)
 - c. "Does not IMPUTE iniquity" (Ps. 32:2)
 - d. "CREDITED TO him as righteous" (Rom. 4:3-10, 22-24; 5:9-10)

C. Its significance

- 1. Man's justification before GOD is always based on God's GRACE through Christ's LIFE, DEATH, and RESURRECTION (Isa. 53:11; Rom. 3:4, 24, 28; 4:25; 5:9; 2 Cor. 5:21; Titus 3:7)
- 2. Justification is a FREE GIFT, not something EARNED by WORKS (Rom. 3:20-30; 4:1-12; 5:15-17; 6:23; Gal. 2:16-21; Eph. 2:8-10)
- 3. The means of justification is FAITH, apart from any WORKS (Rom. 3:22, 26-30; 4:1-12, 16; 5:1; Gal. 3:8, 11; Eph. 2:8-9)

II. The Roman Church's OPPOSITION to Biblical Justification

- A. Misrepresent idea of *sola fide* as "by faith ONLY" rather than as intended "by faith ALONE" (cf. James 2:24)
- B. Claim that JAMES and PAUL contradict one another
 - JAMES uses "justify" in its GENERAL sense, meaning that you should
 VALIDATE your faith before OTHERS by YOUR OWN works
 - 2. PAUL uses "justify" in its LEGAL sense, meaning that you ACQUIRE justification only through FAITH in the finished work of CHRIST

III. The Roman Church's ADDITIONS to Faith for Justification

- A. One must be a MEMBER of the Roman Church
- B. One must be BAPTIZED by the Roman Church
- C. One must be CONFIRMED by a PRIEST of the Roman Church
- D. One must make CONFESSION to a PRIEST of Rome
- E. One must do PENANCE to find FORGIVENESS
- F. One must participate in the MASS to acquire GRACE
- G. One must receive "LAST RITES" from a PRIEST
- H. Even then, justification is INCOMPLETE, since nearly all will go to PURGATORY for cleansing

IV. Conclusions

- A. Rome is WRONG on justification, the heart of the Gospel—CHRIST'S work, not OURS, is the meritorious basis of salvation
- B. Therefore, Rome is teaching a "CONTRARY GOSPEL" and cannot be described as a true CHRISTIAN CHURCH (Gal. 1:8-9)
