 - 6. <u>Lord God of Hosts</u> (1:24)—used 8 times

 - g. Would bring SALVATION through personal SUFFERING (50:4-9; 52:13-53:12)
 - h. Would SAVE those GIVEN to Him by the Father (8:18)
 - i. Would become the CORNERSTONE of the Church (28:16; cf. 1 Pet. 2:24-25)
