## HEZEKIAH'S MIRACULOUS RECOVERY (2 Kings 20:1-21)

- I. Hezekiah's ILLNESS (2 Kings 20:1-6)
  - A. He was MORTALLY ill
  - B. Isaiah came with a MESSAGE from GOD
    - 1. Pronounced that he would DIE
    - 2. Counseled him to "SET YOUR HOUSE IN ORDER"
  - C. Hezekiah PRAYED
    - 1. Stated his own FAITHFULNESS
    - 2. "Wept BITTERLY"
  - D. Isaiah RETURNED with another message from GOD
    - 1. "I have HEARD your prayer and seen your TEARS"
    - 2. "I will HEAL you" FULLY in THREE DAYS
    - 3. "I will add FIFTEEN YEARS to your life"
    - 4. "I will DEFEND you and this city from ASSYRIA for My own SAKE and for DAVID'S"
- II. Hezekiah's RECOVERY (2 Kings 20:7-11)
  - A. God used EXTERNAL means to TREAT Hezekiah
  - B. Hezekiah asked for a SIGN (cf. Isa. 7:11-13)
  - C. He was given TWO CHOICES

- 1. Either the SHADOW could DESCEND ten steps
- 2. Or the SHADOW could ASCEND ten steps
- D. He chose the LATTER
  - 1. The HARDER because it REVERSED the natural order
  - 2. The more APPROPRIATE because it implied ADDING TIME
- III. Hezekiah's FOLLY (2 Kings 20:12-21)
  - A. He was VISITED by an envoy from BABYLON (cf. 2 Chron. 32:31)
    - 1. Had heard of his RECOVERY from ILLNESS
    - 2. Wanted to enquire about the MIRACLE "in the LAND"
    - 3. Probably desired an ALLIANCE against ASSYRIA
  - B. He SHOWED them ALL he had
  - C. Isaiah REBUKED him for his FOLLY
    - 1. The WEALTH will be LOST
    - 2. His CHILDREN would be CAPTIVES
  - D. Hezekiah responded with ACCEPTANCE
  - E. His reign ends with more COMMENDATION (cf. 2 Chron. 32:30, 33)
- IV. Lessons
  - A. God's HARD word is not always His LAST word
  - B. God's BLESSINGS often come through TRIALS
  - C. We are SAFEST when Scripture makes us TREMBLE
