## Causes of a Lack of Discernment: Part 2

- I. Disappearing DISCIPLINE (1 Corinthian 5:1-13)
  - A. Positive effects of DISCIPLINE
    - 1. Discipline REQUIRES discernment
      - a. Motivated by concern for GOD'S HONOR
      - b. Motivated by concern for CONGREGATION'S WELFARE
      - c. Motivated by concern for OFFENDER'S RECLAMATION
    - 2. Discipline EXERCISES discernment
      - a. Involves WEIGHING of EVIDENCE
      - b. Requires making IMPORTANT DECISIONS
    - 3. Discipline PRODUCES discernment
      - a. Developed in those DISCIPLINED
      - b. Developed in those DISCIPLINING/DISCIPLING
  - B. Negative effects of LAWLESSNESS
    - 1. Undisciplined behavior minimizes CONCERN for TRUTH
    - Undisciplined behavior eliminates BARRIER between the WORLD and the CHURCH
      - a. Christians engaging in WORLDLY PURSUITS (James 4:4)

- b. Unbelievers involved in CHURCH MINISTRY (Acts 5:12b-14)
- II. Denying ABSOLUTES (Matthew 6:24)
  - A. Discernment distinguishes between RIGHT and WRONG—absolute TRUTH
    - 1. GOD presents antitheses
      - a. Tree of KNOWLEDGE vs. Tree of LIFE (Gen. 2:17; 3:22)
      - b. CLEAN vs. UNCLEAN (Hag. 2:11-14)
      - c. LIGHT vs. DARKNESS (1 John 1:6-7)
      - d. Way of DESTRUCTION vs. Way of LIFE (Ps. 1:1-2)
      - e. Eternal LIFE vs. Eternal CONDEMNATION (Jn. 3:18)
    - 2. WORLD presents ambiguity
      - a. Psychology—seeking greater "MENTAL HEALTH"
      - b. Business management techniques—seeking what WORKS
      - c. Politics—seeking to satisfy the MAJORITY
      - d. Sociology—seeking equality of TREATMENT
      - e. Education—seeking equality of OUTCOME
  - B. Discernment distinguishes between GOOD and EVIL—absolute MORALITY
    - 1. God says "To err is SIN"—there is no EXCUSE (Rom. 1:20; 3:10, 23)
    - 2. World says, "To err is HUMAN"—it is EXCUSABLE
