JUDAH'S CONTINUING COLLAPSE (2 Kings 24:17 – 25:21)

- I. Zedekiah's RECKLESSNESS (2 Kings 24:17-20)
 - A. His SUMMARY (24:17-19)
 - 1. Placed on the throne at age TWENTY-ONE by the king of BABYLON
 - 2. Reigned for ELEVEN YEARS
 - 3. Was as EVIL as his BROTHER Jehoiakim
 - B. Supplementary information
 - 1. He IGNORED the word of the Lord, but wanted Jeremiah to PRAY for them (Jer. 37:2-16)
 - 2. He had Jeremiah BEATEN and IMPRISONED, but wanted to hear from GOD (Jer. 37:17)
 - 3. He decreed all Hebrew SLAVES must be FREED, then let their former masters TAKE THEM BACK (34:9-22)
 - C. His STUPIDITY (24:20)
 - 1. Explained as evidence of God's ANGER and intent to JUDGE Judah
 - 2. He REBELLED against the king of BABYLON
- II. Babylon's RETRIBUTION (2 Kings 25:1-7)
 - A. Nebuchadnezzar LAY SEIGE to Jerusalem (25:1)

- B. The hypocrite asked JEREMIAH to ask GOD for help (Jer. 21:1-14; 34:1-5)
- C. The siege lasted about 18 MONTHS (2 Kings 25:2-3)
- D. Zedekiah and his GUARDS tried to ESCAPE (25:4-7)
 - 1. They were CAPTURED
 - 2. Zedekiah's SONS were SLAUGHTERED in his presence
 - 3. Zedekiah's EYES were GOUGED OUT
 - 4. Zedekiah was SHACKLED and taken PRISONER to Babylon
- III. Jerusalem's RUIN (2 Kings 25:8-21)
 - A. They BURNED the TEMPLE and every RESIDENCE (vv. 8-9)
 - B. They razed the WALL around the city (v. 10)
 - C. They DEPORTED all but the POOREST to Babylon (vv. 11-12)
 - D. They took the last remaining TREASURES from the city (vv. 13-17)
 - E. They took the surviving OFFICIALS to Babylon for EXECUTION (vv. 18-21)

IV. Lessons

- A. Defying God in pursuit of HAPPINESS results in profound SORROW
- B. Defying God for POLITICAL EXPEDIENCY provokes divine WRATH
- C. The LEADERS God gives a nation may be part of His JUDGMENT on that nation
