JERUSALEM'S FALL

(Lamentations 1:1-2:22)

- I. The MISERY and DESOLATION of Jerusalem (Lamentations 1)
 - JEREMIAH'S sorrow (1:1-11) A.
 - 1. The once GREAT city has become a destitute SLAVE
 - 2. She had relied on HUMAN support and been BETRAYED
 - 3. DISASTER has fallen after a long period of TROUBLE
 - 4. The city is DESOLATE and GRIEVING
 - 5. This is God's JUDGMENT for their SINS
 - 6. Their LEADERS thought only of themselves and tried to FLEE
 - Her WEALTH had been no protection 7.
 - 8. Their ADULTERIES have brought them SCORN and SHAME
 - 9. Wanton pursuit of lusts has led to RUIN without a COMFORTER
 - 10. HEATHENS had plundered and destroyed the SANCTUARY
 - 11. They exchanged all they held DEAR for FOOD
 - B. JERUSALEM'S sorrow (1:12-22)
 - 1. No one CARES about her suffering God's WRATH (12)
 - 2. The penetrating affliction that left her COLLAPSING in DESPAIR (13)
 - 3. They have fallen PREY due to the WEIGHT of their SIN (14)
 - 4. God had APPOINTED the time for their DESTRUCTION (15)
 - 5. They WEEP because of their DESOLATION without PITY (16)
 - 6. They are DESPISED by their neighbors as UNCLEAN (17)
 - 7. They affirm God's JUSTICE and their own GUILT (18)
 - 8. They admit they sought aid from ALLIES and their spiritual leaders were concerned only for their OWN WELFARE (19)
 - 9. They beg God to NOTICE their DISTRESS (20)
 - 10. They beg God to DESTROY their ENEMIES (21-22)

II. The DESTRUCTION of Jerusalem (Lamentations 2)

- A. The LORD'S perspective (2:1-9)
 - 1. The Lord's STORM of anger even cast down the TEMPLE (1)
 - 2. The Lord DISGRACED/DISHONORED the nation (2)
 - 3. No longer her HELPER, the Lord has become Judah's ENEMY (3-5)
 - 4. The Lord DESTROYED His own "TABERNACLE" (6-7)
 - 5. Jerusalem's destruction was the DELIBERATE PLAN of God (8-9)
- B. A HUMAN perspective (2:10-17)
 - 1. All Jerusalem is overcome with GRIEF and HUMILIATION (10)
 - 2. Jeremiah is especially distraught by the impact on the CHILDREN (11-12)
 - 3. Jeremiah wants to COMFORT Jerusalem, but their wound is too DEEP to be HEALED (13)
 - 4. False prophets told them what they WANTED to hear instead of CONFRONTING their SIN (14)
 - 5. Their enemies MOCK them for their CALAMITY (15-16)
 - 6. Even their SCORN was the Lord's DOING (17)
- C. JEREMIAH'S prayer (2:18-22)
 - 1. Jeremiah calls Jerusalem to REPENTANCE and PRAYER (18-19)
 - 2. Jeremiah ACCUSES God of being EXCESSIVELY harsh (20-21)
 - a. Women are EATING their CHILDREN
 - b. Priests and prophets were MURDERED in the TEMPLE
 - c. INDISCRIMINATE slaughter left the dead in the STREETS
 - 3. Jeremiah MOURNS the annihilation of those he'd tried to NURTURE (22)
