## SORROWS AND PRAYERS

(Lamentations 4:1 - 5:22)

- I. God's WRATH Detailed (Lamentations 4:1-22)
  - A. Remembrance of BETTER DAYS in JERUSALEM (4:1-11)
    - The once PRECIOUS kingdom had been reduced to the value of CLAY POTS (1 2)
    - 2. Caring only for themselves, they ABANDONED their CHILDREN (3-4)
    - 3. The WEALTHY have been IMPOVERISHED for their SIN (5-6)
    - 4. Even those dedicated to PURITY have greatly SUFFERED (7-8)
    - 5. It is better to be SLAIN in BATTLE than die by STARVATION (9-10)
    - 6. This had all been the outworking of GOD'S WRATH (11)
  - B. The sins of Jerusalem's PROPHETS and PRIESTS (4:12-16)
    - 1. The city thought IMPREGNABLE had FALLEN (12)
    - 2. Her PROPHETS and PRIESTS had LIED to them (13-14)
    - 3. Defiled with BLOOD, they were UNCLEAN OUTCASTS (15-16)
  - C. Jerusalem's VAIN search for HELP (4:17-20)
    - 1. They found no one who could HELP (17)
    - 2. The enemy moved FREELY through the CITY so that no place was SECURE (18)
    - 3. The enemy moved SWIFTLY through the COUNTRY so that no place was SAFE (19)
    - 4. The KING they thought would PROTECT them had been CAPTURED (20)

- D. The coming PUNISHMENT upon EDOM (4:21-22)
  - 1. Edom should not GLOAT because of Judah's SUFFERING (21)
  - 2. Edom's JUDGMENT is still COMING and will be WORSE (22)
- II. The PRAYERS of the Remnant (Lamentations 5:1-22)
  - A. Their prayer that the Lord would REMEMBER them (5:1-18)
    - 1. They have BECOME what they DESPISED (1-3)
    - 2. Their lives have become HARSH (4-5)
    - 3. They SINNED by relying on Egypt and Assyria for their SUPPORT (6-7)
    - 4. People they once ENSLAVED were now their MASTERS (8-10)
    - 5. Their people had been ABUSED by the CONQUERORS (11-13)
    - 6. They had lost all JOY and despaired of HOPE (14-18)
  - B. Their prayer that the Lord would RESTORE them (5:19-22)
    - 1. They affirm God's ETERNAL SOVEREIGNTY (19)
    - 2. They ask that God's WRATH not ENDURE as long as His THRONE (20)
    - 3. Unless His rejection is TOTAL and FINAL, they beg for RESTORATION (21-

22)
