INTRODUCTION TO JOHN'S GOSPEL

- I. AUTHOR of the Gospel of John
 - A. Earliest testimony ascribes it to JOHN the son of ZEBEDEE
 - B. Internal evidence supports JOHN as the author
 - 1. The author was a JEW
 - 2. The author was a PALESTINIAN JEW
 - 3. The author was an EYEWITNESS
 - 4. The author was an APOSTLE
 - 5. The author was JOHN, the son of Zebedee
- II. CONTEXT of the Gospel of John
 - A. Date of writing: between A.D. 65 and 90
 - B. Place of writing: most solid tradition says EPHESUS

III. CHARACTERISTICS of the Gospel of John

- A. Its content is UNIQUE
 - 1. Many features common to the Synoptics are MISSING
 - 2. About 90% is material NOT FOUND in the Synoptics
- B. John and the Synoptics are COMPLIMENTARY by DIVINE design
 - 1. The differences are not CONTRADICTIONS
 - 2. The differences should not be EXAGGERATED
- C. John's emphasis is more THEOLOGICAL than BIOGRAPHICAL
 - 1. The Synoptics focus on what you need to KNOW about WHAT Jesus DID
 - 2. John focuses on what you need to BELIEVE about WHO Jesus IS
- IV. PURPOSE of the Gospel of John (John 20:31)
 - A. Its APOLOGETIC purpose: "So that you may BELIEVE..."
 - 1. To demonstrate that Jesus is the CHRIST
 - 2. To demonstrate that Jesus is the SON OF GOD
 - B. Its EVANGELISTIC purpose: "and that believing you may have LIFE in His NAME"
