SIGNIFICANCE OF THE FOUR ETERNAL COVENANTS

- I. Two Kinds of Covenants
 - A. Unconditional—God obligates Himself to bring DEFINITE BLESSING upon the covenant people by saying, "I WILL"
- B. Conditional—God promises to bring blessing by saying "IF YOU will, then I WILL," usually promising PUNISHMENT if man FAILS to fulfill the condition
- II. The ABRAHAMIC Covenant (Gen. 12:1-3; 13:14-17; 15:1-7; 17:1-18)
 - A. Abraham's NAME would be GREAT
 - B. A great NATION would come from Abraham
 - C. Abraham would so great a blessing that ALL FAMILIES would be blessed
 - D. The LAND of Palestine would be given to Abraham and his descendants as an inheritance FOREVER
 - E. His descendants would be as the DUST of the EARTH and the STARS of the SKY
 - F. Whoever blessed him would be BLESSED and whoever cursed him would be CURSED
 - G. He would be the father of MANY NATIONS
 - H. KINGS would descend from him
 - I. The covenant would be PERPETUAL
 - J. The land of Canaan would be an EVERLASTING POSSESSION

- K. GOD would be GOD to Abraham and his descendants
- L. His descendants would POSSESS the gate of his ENEMIES
- M. In his descendants ALL NATIONS would be blessed
- III. The PALESTINIAN Covenant (Deut. 28:63-68; 30:1-9)
 - A. The nation would be REMOVED from the LAND for unfaithfulness (28:63-68)
 - B. A FUTURE generation of Israel would REPENT (30:1-2)
 - C. Their MESSIAH will RETURN (30:3-4)
 - D. Israel will be RESTORED to the LAND (30:5)
 - E. Israel will be CONVICTED of their SIN (30:6)
 - F. Israel's ENEMIES will be JUDGED (30:7)
 - G. The nation will then receive her FULL BLESSING (30:8-9)
- IV. Eschatological Implications of These Covenants
 - A. MANY provisions have already been fulfilled LITERALLY
 - B. We should expect REMAINING provisions to be fulfilled LITERALLY
 - 1. Israel has never yet OCCUPIED ALL THE LAND promised
 - 2. Israel's occupation of the land has yet to be ETERNAL
 - 3. Therefore, those MUST happen in a time still FUTURE
 - C. Thus, the Abrahamic and Palestinian Covenants give STRONG SUPPORT to Premillennial eschatology
