## WHAT JESUS' DEATH MEANT TO HIM (John 14:28-31)

- I. His MINISTRY Would Be Vindicated (John 14:28*b*)
  - A. If they LOVED Him, they would REJOICE
  - B. He is overjoyed to be RETURNING to His FATHER
    - 1. As a man, Jesus endured human WEAKNESS
    - 2. As a man, Jesus had LIMITED His DIVINE prerogatives
    - 3. As a man, Jesus' FELLOWSHIP with the Father was less DIRECT
  - C. That the Father would WELCOME Him HOME was His vindication
  - D. While on EARTH, He accepted a subordinate place under the DIRECTION of the Father
- II. His MESSAGE Would Be Verified (John 14:29-30*a*)
  - A. The disciples had emphatically stated their FAITH in Christ (Matt. 16:15-16; John 6:66-69)
  - B. Jesus wanted to reinforce their eroding CONFIDENCE
- 1. Only God could PREDICT the future RELIABLY/ACCURATELY (Isa. 42:9; 46:9-10; cf. 41:22-24)
  - 2. Once He rose from the dead, they would NEVER DOUBT again (cf. John 2:19-22)
  - C. Their course of INSTRUCTION was nearly COMPLETE

- III. His MISSION Would Be Victorious (John 14:30*b*)
  - A. SATAN was coming to try to DEFEAT Jesus
    - 1. May have referred to those coming to BETRAY and ARREST Him
    - 2. Probably refers to Satan's attempt to KILL HIM in Gethsemane (Matt. 26:36-46; Mark 14:32-42; Luke 22:41-46)
  - B. Satan would not SUCCEED
- IV. His MOTIVATION Would Be Validated (John 14:31)
  - A. He would prove that He LOVES the Father
  - B. He would prove that He OBEYS the Father
