THE MINISTRY OF HAGGAI ARISE AND BUILD (Haggai 1:1-15)

- I. The REBUKE (Haggai 1:1-4)
 - A. Timing: the 2nd year of the Persian King DARIUS, the 1st day of the 6th month
 - B. Source: from the LORD, through the PROPHET
 - C. Target: Zerubbabel, the GOVERNOR; and Jeshua, the HIGH PRIEST
 - D. Setting: the assembly at the ALTAR in the OPEN AIR
 - E. Message
 - 1. "You say, 'It's not TIME to rebuild the TEMPLE"
 - 2. "The LORD says, 'Is it TIME for you to live in PANELED houses while THIS house lies desolate?""
- II. The CALAMITY (Haggai 1:5-6)
 - A. Haggai reminded them of the divine AUTHORITY of his message
 - B. Haggai reminded them that God is more to be FEARED than the opposition
 - C. Haggai commands them to EXAMINE and PONDER their "ways"
 - 1. They sowed PLENTIFULLY, but harvested LITTLE
 - 2. They ATE, but were never SATISFIED

- 3. They DRANK, but did not have ENOUGH
- 4. They had CLOTHING, but were never WARM
- 5. They earned WAGES, but could ACCUMULATE nothing
- III. The CHARGE (Haggai 1:7-8)
 - A. Haggai restates the LORD's command to "CONSIDER your WAYS!"
 - B. They must BUY the materials and BUILD the Temple
 - C. The Lord would be PLEASED and GLORIFIED
- IV. The JUDGMENTS (Haggai 1:9-11)
 - A. Haggai EXPLAINS the SIGNIFICANCE of the various calamites
 - B. God made their necessities so EXPENSIVE that whatever they earned was never ENOUGH
 - C. God made their labor FRUSTRATINGLY UNPRODUCTIVE
 - D. God will PROVIDE for those who make HIS GLORY a higher priority than their own WEALTH or COMFORT
- V. The OBEDIENCE (Haggai 1:12-15)
 - A. The people OBEYED the Lord
 - B. By this they showed REVERENCE for the Lord
 - C. The Lord declared, "I AM WITH YOU"
 - D. The people RESUMED the CONSTRUCTION of the Temple
