NEHEMIAH'S BURDEN

(Nehemiah 1:1-11)

- I. NEWS from Jerusalem (Neh. 1:1-3)
 - A. Establishing the IDENTITY of Nehemiah (1:1)
 - 1. His name means "The LORD COMFORTS"
 - 2. It was late-FALL to early-WINTER of 445 BC
 - 3. He was in SUSA, the capital
 - B. Receiving the REPORT (1:2-3)
 - 1. A DELEGATION arrived from Jerusalem
 - 2. He asked about the status of the REMNANT and JERUSALEM
 - 3. They reported the PEOPLE were distressed and the WALLS and GATES were rubble
- II. DISTRESS in Susa (Neh. 1:4-11)
 - A. Nehemiah's CONFESSION of SIN (1:4-7)
 - 1. It came from profound GRIEF
 - 2. He acknowledged God's universal AUTHORITY
 - 3. He praised God's FAITHFULNESS
 - 4. He acknowledged the need for OBEDIENCE

- 5. He identified HIMSELF among the SINNERS
- B. Nehemiah's PLEA for God's HELP (1:8-11)
 - 1. He acknowledged the JUSTICE of Israel's EXILE
 - 2. He claimed the PROMISE of RESTORATION if they RETURNED
 - 3. He affirmed that the Jews remained God's PEOPLE whom He had REDEEMED
 - 4. He asked God to make him "SUCCESSFUL" and grant him "COMPASSION" before the king
 - 5. He was CUPBEARER to the KING

III. Lessons

- A. Godly prayer acknowledges the AUTHORITY of SCRIPTURE
- B. When your prayer is CONSISTENT with Scripture, you can expect God to ANSWER
- C. DELIVERANCE comes ONLY from God
- D. Accomplishing the Lord's work frequently requires the service of DEDICATED LAYMEN
 - 1. Don't ABANDON the work to the "PROFESSIONALS"
 - 2. Don't HESITATE because you think you aren't QUALIFIED
