NEHEMIAH'S PREPARATION

(Nehemiah 2:1-20)

- I. Nehemiah's MISSION to Restore Jerusalem (Neh. 2:1-8)
 - A. Nehemiah's OPPORTUNITY (2:1-2)
 - 1. Nehemiah was VISIBLY DISTRESSED
 - 2. Nehemiah was "VERY MUCH AFRAID"
 - B. Nehemiah's REQUEST (2:3-5)
 - 1. "The place of my FATHERS' TOMBS lies desolate" and the city "GATES have been consumed by FIRE"
 - 2. "I PRAYED to the God of heaven"
 - 3. "Send me to JUDAH, the CITY of my fathers' tombs, that I may REBUILD it"
 - C. Artaxerxes' RESPONSE (2:6-8)
 - 1. He asked how much TIME he NEEDED
 - 2. He provided letters authorizing PASSAGE
 - 3. He authorized requisitioning all the TIMBER he'd need
 - 4. Nehemiah gave GOD the CREDIT for this outcome
- II. Nehemiah's ARRIVAL in Jerusalem (Neh. 2:9-20)
 - A. Nehemiah's COMMISSION (2:9-10)

- 1. He delivered the king's LETTERS to the GOVERNORS
- 2. This DISTURBED Sanballat and Tobiah
- B. Nehemiah's INSPECTION (2:11-16)
 - 1. He took a SMALL group for a SECRET inspection
 - 2. He found the walls COLLAPSED and the gates BURNED
- C. Nehemiah's CHARGE (2:17-18)
 - 1. He pointed out Jerusalem's DESOLATION
 - 2. He called for their HELP to REBUILD the city wall
 - 3. He wanted to remove their REPROACH
 - 4. The people SUPPORTED his plan
- D. Nehemiah's OPPOSITION (2:19-20)
 - Sanballat, Tobiah, and Geshem MOCKED them and accused him of TREASON
 - 2. Nehemiah affirmed his CONFIDENCE in GOD
 - 3. Nehemiah committed to IGNORING their THREATS
 - 4. Nehemiah declared his opponents had no LEGAL, MORAL, or HISTORICAL claim in Jerusalem
