God's Plan of Grace and Mercy (Judges 1-2)

- I. Continuing Conquest of Canaan After Joshua (Judges 1:1-36)
 - A. <u>Judah</u> takes the lead (vv. 1-7)
 - 1. Israel consulted the Lord after Joshua died (v. 1)
 - 2. <u>Judah</u> was chosen by the Lord to lead the nation into the land (v. 2)
 - 3. With the help of Simeon, Judah began the campaign (v. 3)
 - 4. Adoni-Bezek is defeated and mutilated (vv. 4-7)
 - a. Noble and courteous men of Abraham's time
 - i. Aner, Eshcol and Mamre (Gen. 14)
 - ii. Ephram the Hittite (Gen. 23)
 - iii. Abimelech, king of Gerar (Gen. 20)
 - iv. Melchizedek (Gen. 14:18, Heb. 6-7)
 - b. Over 400 years later
 - i. Idolatry has severely corrupted the land of Canaan
 - ii. Israel is used by God to <u>execute judgment</u> on these heathen nations
 - B. Victories and failures in taking the land (vv. 8-36)
- II. Israel's Disobedience and God's Faithfulness (Judges 2:1-23)
 - A. The Lord's rebuke of Israel (vv. 1-5)
 - 1. Angel of the Lord delivers the message (vv. 1-3)

- a. He comes from Gilgal to Bochim, or "weeping" (v. 1)
- b. He tells Israel they had <u>disobeyed</u> God's commands (v. 2)
- c. He passes judgment on Israel (v. 3)
- 2. Israel responds with repentance and worship (vv. 4-5)
- B. Recap of the death of <u>Joshua</u> (vv. 6-10)
- C. The unfaithfulness of Israel (vv. 11-15)
 - 1. They served the false gods of the inhabitants of Canaan
 - 2. They <u>abandoned</u> the Lord
 - 3. The Lord's anger was kindled against Israel (v. 14)
- D. The Lord raises up judges (vv. 16-23)
 - 1. Repeating cycle
 - a. Israel would rebel against God
 - b. God would send suffering through an oppressor
 - c. Israel would repent
 - b. God would save them from their enemies through a judge
 - 2. Increasing corruption after the death of each judge

Applications:

- 1. Israel needed something more than a human judge
- 2. Israel needed something more than a human king
- 3. So do we! Jesus Christ is our perfect <u>prophet</u>, our final <u>high priest</u>, our righteous <u>judge</u>, and the king of all kings.
