INTRODUCTION TO MATTHEW'S GOSPEL (Matthew 1:1)

I. Authenticity

- A. Appearance—Written between AD 55 and 60
- B. Author—Written by MATTHEW (Matt. 9:9; 10:3)
 - 1. He was a TAX COLLECTOR
 - 2. He became an APOSTLE of Christ

C. Acceptance

- 1. Immediately RECOGNIZED as Scripture
- 2. The "Synoptic PROBLEM"
 - a. Their accounts have significant DIFFERENCES
 - b. They wrote under INSPIRATION, and God has the right to determine WHAT He wanted them to SAY
 - c. EYEWITNESSES remember different DETAILS

II. Message
