## Judges - Such a Great Salvation! Judges 3:1-11

- I. God's Plan of <u>Testing</u> His People

    - 1. Israel <u>dwelt among</u> the foreigners
    - 2. They <u>intermarried</u> with the foreigners
    - 3. They <u>served the gods</u> of the foreigners

## II. The Judges in Action

- A. Othniel, the First Identified Judge
  - 1. God's <u>anger</u> results in an <u>oppressor</u>, Cushan-Rishathaim, being appointed (v. 8)
  - 2. The <u>cries</u> of Israel result in the appointment of a <u>deliverer</u> (vv. 9-10)
  - 3. There is <u>rest in the land</u> (v. 11)

## Lessons:

- 1. God is <u>sovereign</u> over <u>governmental affairs</u>.
- 2. God draws us to <u>repentance</u> both through His <u>goodness</u> and His <u>severity</u>.
- 3. God's judgment and discipline fall on those who turn from Him.
- 4. God's <u>power</u> is available to those who will <u>stand</u> against evil on His behalf.
