Matthew—55

THE CALL OF MATTHEW (Matthew 9:9-13)

- I. Matthew's CALL (Matt. 9:9)
 - A. His situation was NORMAL: he was AT WORK
 - B. His occupation was DESPISED: he was a TAX COLLECTOR
 - C. His call was GRACIOUS: he was a SINNER
 - D. His response was IMMEDIATE: he LEFT EVERYTHING (cf. Lk. 5:28)

II. Matthew's HOSPITALITY (Matt. 9:10)

- A. He hosted a DINNER for JESUS and His DISCIPLES—
- B. Many TAX COLLECTORS and SINNERS also came to dine

III. Pharisees' CRITICISM (Matt. 9:11)

- A. They SAW Jesus eating with the DISREPUTABLE/RIFFRAFF/OUTCASTS
 - 1. Jesus RISKED ceremonial DEFILEMENT
 - 2. This DAMAGED Jesus' REPUTATION
- B. They asked WHY He would do so

- 1. They are not asking for INFORMATION but are making an ACCUSATION
- 2. They challenged the DISCIPLES rather than JESUS
- 3. They CONTEMPTUOUSLY lumped Him with the "tax collectors and sinners"
- 4. They RESENTED Jesus' unwillingness to associate with THEM

IV. Jesus' INSTRUCTION (Matt. 9:12-13)

- A. Their attitude DEFIED human LOGIC
 - 1. A physician is needed by the SICK not the HEALTHY
 - 2. Therefore, a physician must ASSOCIATE with those who NEED him
- B. Their attitude DISREGARDED God's WORD (cf. Hos. 6:6)
 - 1. They were all about RITUAL, but God wants COMPASSION
 - 2. Jesus told them to "GO and LEARN" the Scriptures they claimed to defend
- C. Their attitude DENIED Jesus' AUTHORITY
 - 1. He had a MISSION they did not UNDERSTAND
 - 2. He had not come to call the RIGHTEOUS, but SINNERS
