BLASPHEMY AGAINST THE HOLY SPIRIT (Matthew 12:22-32)

- I. The ACTIVITY (Matt. 12:22)
 - A. Jesus encountered a DEMON-POSSESSED man who was BLIND and MUTE
 - B. Jesus HEALED him, restoring SPEECH and SIGHT
- II. The AMAZEMENT (Matt. 12:23)
 - A. This ASTONISHED the CROWDS
 - B. They wondered if Jesus MIGHT BE the MESSIAH
- III. The ACCUSATION (Matt. 12:24)
 - A. The Pharisees could not DISPUTE the MIRACLE
 - 1. Required SUPERNATURAL POWER
 - 2. Could be only GOD'S or SATAN'S
 - B. They accused Jesus of using SATAN'S POWER (cf. 9:34; 10:25)
- IV. The ANSWER (Matt. 12:25-30)
 - A. Their accusation was ABSURD: a DIVIDED kingdom will FALL (12:25b-26)
 - B. Their accusation was HYPOCRITICAL: used a DIFFERENT standard for their OWN exorcists (12:27)

- C. Their accusation was DEFIANT: denied what they KNEW to be TRUE (12:28-30)
 - 1. He OBVIOUSLY worked by "the Spirit of GOD"
 - 2. That PROVED He'd come to introduce the KINGDOM
 - 3. His despoiling Satan's "house" meant He is STRONGER than SATAN
- D. Those who don't ACCEPT Him are OPPOSING Him
- V. The ANATHEMA (Matt. 12:31-32)
 - A. God offers COMPREHENSIVE forgiveness
 - 1. Any SIN can be forgiven
 - 2. Any BLASPHEMY can be forgiven
 - B. The ONLY exception is "BLASPHEMY against the SPIRIT"
 - 1. This is not CURSING in the Spirit's NAME
 - 2. This is not DENYING the reality of MIRACLES
 - 3. This is not Israel's NATIONAL sin of rejecting CHRIST
 - 4. This is may be PERSISTENT UNBELIEF
 - 5. This is probably DEFIANTLY and DECEPTIVELY identifying the Holy Spirit as SATAN
