(Judges 8:4-35)

- I. Two Cities Refuse to Render Aid to Gideon and His Men (vv. 4-9)
  - A. Succoth and Penuel
  - B. Gideon rightfully requested aid
  - C. Leaders of both cities <u>refused to provide food</u> for <u>Gideon and his troops</u>
  - D. Gideon promises retribution
    - Showed Gideon's <u>faith and confidence</u> in the <u>victory</u> God would <u>provide</u>
    - 2. Provided the <u>leaders of the cities</u> an <u>opportunity</u> to <u>repent and</u>
      <a href="mailto:change their minds">change their minds</a>
- II. Gideon and His Army Complete Their Mission
  - A. The <u>capture</u> of the <u>Midianite kings</u> (vv. 10-12)
  - B. Gideon Enforces Judgment on Succoth and Penuel (vv. 13-17)
  - C. Gideon Enforces Judgment on the Midianite kings (vv. 18-21)
- III. Gideon's Life After Delivering Israel
  - A. Gideon is offered a kingship over Israel (vv. 22-27)
    - 1. Gideon <u>denied the kingship</u> with his <u>speech</u>

- 2. Gideon <u>acquiesced to kingship</u> with his <u>actions</u>
- 3. Gideon <u>created an idol</u> for Israel and a <u>trap for his family</u>
- B. God grants peace to the land (v. 28)
- C. Gideon's personal life after delivering Israel (vv. 29-32)
  - 1. Gideon's children
  - 2. Gideon's wives
  - 3. Gideon's death
- D. Life in Israel after Gideon's death (vv. 33-35)
  - 1. Return to Baal worship
  - 2. Loss of loyalty to Gideon's family

## Lessons:

- 1) We should not get disillusioned by the failures of God's people.
- 2) We must recognize our own tendencies to make ephods and to spurn the gifts of God.
- 3) We must do the things God calls us to do so that we can finish well.
