TWO PARABLES ABOUT INFLUENCE (Matthew 13:31-35)

- I. The Parable of the MUSTARD SEED (Matt. 13:31-32)
 - A. Jesus' PARABLE
 - 1. He's describing a CHARACTERISTIC of the "KINGDOM of heaven"
 - 2. Mustard was the SMALLEST seed they CULTIVATED
 - 3. It grew into the LARGEST of their "GARDEN PLANTS"
 - 4. BIRDS could NEST in its branches
 - B. Jesus' POINT
 - The kingdom's BEGINNING would be SMALL and seem INSIGNIFICANT
 - 2. It would GRADUALLY grow LARGER and STRONGER
 - 3. It provides BENEFIT even for those NOT of the kingdom
- II. The Parable of the LEAVEN (Matt. 13:33)
 - A. Jesus' PARABLE
 - 1. He's describing a CHARACTERISTIC of the "KINGDOM of heaven"
 - 2. A woman could HIDE it in a BUSHEL of FLOUR
 - 3. It PERMEATED the flour so ALL was "leavened"

- B. Jesus' POINT
 - 1. SMALL things can have GREAT influence
 - 2. The Kingdom's influence is POSITIVE
 - 3. Its influence comes from WITHIN
- III. The Parables as FULFILLMENT of PROPHECY (Matt. 13:34-35)
 - A. Jesus is now using parables ALL THE TIME
 - B. His parables are intended to REVEAL truths previous HIDDEN
 - This phase of the kingdom is NEW INFORMATION about God's program of redemption
 - 2. This phase of the kingdom NOT a CHANGE to God's program of redemption
