## Matthew—88

## PREPARING THE APOSTLES TO BE SHEPHERDS (Matthew 14:13-21)

- I. Looking for SOLITUDE (Matt. 14:13)
  - A. Going to a SECLUDED place for REST
  - B. Avoiding potential POLITICAL tensions
- II. Finding no REST (Matt. 14:14)
  - A. The crowd FLOCKED along the ROADS to Jesus' destination
    - 1. He "WENT ASHORE"
    - 2. He saw a "LARGE CROWD"
  - B. Jesus felt deep COMPASSION for them
    - 1. Jesus TAUGHT the multitude (cf. Mk 6:34, Lk 9:11)
    - 2. Jesus HEALED their SICK (cf. Lk 9:11)
- III. Learning the SOURCE of PROVISION (Matt. 14:15-21)
  - A. INTERRUPTING the Lord
    - 1. The disciples were CONCERNED for the PEOPLE

- 2. They had no SOLUTION to the FOOD problem
- B. INSTRUCTING the disciples (14:16-21)
  - 1. Jesus said, "Don't SEND THEM AWAY"
  - 2. Jesus said, "YOU give them something to EAT"
  - 3. They had only "five LOAVES and two FISH"
  - 4. Jesus commanded, "BRING them to ME"
  - 5. Jesus ordered the crowd to RECLINE in the GRASS
  - 6. Jesus BLESSED the food and BROKE it up for distribution
  - 7. He gave it to the DISCIPLES to DISTRIBUTE
  - 8. The food was sufficient for 5000 MEN, besides WOMEN and CHILDREN
  - 9. EVERYONE ate until they were SATISFIED (cf. 5:6)
  - 10. The disciples each got a BASKET for THEMSELVES

## IV. Lessons

- A. Ministry should be MOTIVATED by COMPASSION
- B. God does not expect us to be SUFFICIENT for the work, but to GIVE what we HAVE to Him and trust CHRIST to use it to accomplish His will
- C. When we EXHAUST our resources in service for CHRIST, He will SUSTAIN US
