## JESUS' BLESSING OF LITTLE CHILDREN (Matthew 19:13-15)

- I. The PARTICULAR DETAILS of the Event (Matt. 19:13-15)
  - A. CHILDREN were being BROUGHT to Him (19:13)
    - 1. The PARENTS were bringing them
    - 2. They were YOUNG CHILDREN
    - 3. The children were being BLESSED, not SAVED
    - 4. The disciples "REBUKED them"
  - B. Jesus REBUKED the DISCIPLES (19:14)
    - 1. This was a STERN REBUKE
      - a. He did NOT say the Kingdom belonged to THESE CHILDREN
      - b. They REPRESENTED those to whom the Kingdom BELONGS (Mk. 10:15; Lk. 18:17; cf. Matt. 18:2-3)
    - 2. He was performing an IMPORTANT MINISTRY
      - a. For the PARENTS to know they had ACCESS to Him
      - b. For the CHILDREN to learn of His COMPASSION for them
      - c. For the DISCIPLES to remember the NATURE of the Kingdom

- C. Jesus "DEPARTED from there" (19:15)
  - 1. He blessed ALL who CAME
  - 2. He did not STAY to CONTINUE

## II. The PROVIDENTIAL TIMING of the Event

- A. Jesus had just finished instruction on the PERMANENCE of MARRIAGE (Matt. 19:1-12)
  - 1. Couples must be COMMITTED to TRUSTING GOD together (19:1-12)
  - 2. Parents must be UNITED in bringing their CHILDREN to JESUS (19:13-15; cf. Deut. 6:4-9)
- B. Jesus had commanded the disciples to demonstrate CHILDLIKE HUMILITY (Matt. 18:1-35)
  - 1. One must COME to Him in childlike FAITH (18:1-4)
  - 2. One must LIVE in genuine CONCERN for one another (18:5-14)
  - 3. One must PRACTICE a life of FORGIVENESS (18:15-35)

## III. The POWERFUL LESSONS of the Event

- A. MINISTRY must include INSTRUCTION of CHILDREN
- B. FAMILY life must be CHRIST centered
- C. Participation in the KINGDOM requires CHILDLIKE faith
