JESUS GIVES SIGHT TO THE BLIND (Matthew 20:29-34)

- I. The Blind Men's PLEA (Matt. 20:29-31; cf. Mk. 10:46-48; Lk. 18:35-39)
 - A. Jesus and His disciples were LEAVING JERICHO
 - 1. They had ENTERED earlier that DAY
 - 2. Jesus had met ZACCHEUS (Lk 19:1ff)
 - 3. There was a LARGE CROWD following Jesus
 - a. Some were DISCIPLES of Jesus
 - b. Most were TRAVELERS going for PASSOVER
 - 4. They were moving on to JERUSALEM (Mt. 20:17-19)
 - B. Two BLIND men heard that JESUS was there
 - 1. They SHOUTED to attract His ATTENTION
 - 2. They addressed Jesus as "LORD, SON of DAVID"
 - 3. They asked for His MERCY
 - 4. They were REBUKED by the CROWD
 - 5. They PERSISTED in their CRIES

- II. The Lord's PROVISION (Matt. 20:32-34; cf. Mk. 10:49-52; Lk. 18:40-43)
 - A. Jesus HEARD them and STOPPED (cf. Mk. 10:49-50)
 - 1. They were told, "Take COURAGE, He is CALLING for you"
 - 2. They AROSE and WENT TO Jesus
 - B. Jesus asked, "WHAT do you want ME to DO for you?"
 - 1. This called ATTENTION to their REQUEST
 - 2. This indicated He ACCEPTED the Messianic TITLE
 - C. They wanted to be able to SEE (Mk. 10:51; Lk 18:41)
 - 1. They asked to have their SIGHT RESTORED
 - a. Implies they had LOST sight in the past
 - b. Emphasizes their PHYSICAL sight
 - 2. They asked to have their EYES OPENED (Mt. 20:23)
 - a. Includes the need for PHYSICAL sight
 - b. Implies desire for SPIRITUAL UNDERSTANDING
 - D. In COMPASSION, Jesus TOUCHED their eyes
 - 1. They were able to SEE (cf. Mk. 10:52)
 - 2. They began to FOLLOW Jesus
 - E. This illustrated the PURPOSE of the CROSS
 - 1. Jesus used His power to deliver the BLIND
 - 2. He would NOT use it to deliver HIMSELF
