## WRESTLING WITH GOD (Genesis 32:1-32)

- I. Encounter with ANGELS (Gen. 32:1-2)
  - A. Appeared as Jacob continued toward CANAAN
  - B. Appeared to ENCOURAGE Jacob: he was protected by God's ARMY
    - 1. In the face of ESAU'S HATRED (cf. Gen. 28:12-15)
    - 2. A reminder of God's PROMISES
- II. Emissaries to ESAU (Gen. 32:3-8)
  - A. Their MESSAGE to Esau
    - 1. Acknowledged Esau's socio-political SUPERIORITY
    - 2. Demonstrated Jacob's financial INDEPENDENCE
  - B. Their REPORT about Esau: he's coming with 400 men
  - C. Jacob's REACTION to the news
    - 1. He was "GREATLY AFRAID"
    - 2. Took immediate action to protect his FAMILY and PROPERTY
    - 3. He does not ARM his servants for DEFENSE or ATTACK
- III. Entreaty for DELIVERANCE (Gen. 32:9-12)
  - A. His PRAYER to God
    - 1. Acknowledged God's POWER and FAITHFULNESS
    - 2. Thanked God for His PROMISES and BLESSINGS
    - 3. Admits that he is UNWORTHY

- 4. Cries out for DELIVERANCE
- 5. Asks for NOTHING God has not PROMISED
- IV. Endowment for ESAU (Gen. 32:13-21a)
  - A. Designed to be an OVERWHELMING gesture of GOOD WILL
  - B. Demonstrated the DEGREE of God's BLESSING
    - 1. Jacob offers no APOLOGY, admits no SIN, asks no FORGIVENESS
    - 2. Jacob REFUSES to DEFEND himself
    - 3. Jacob still wants PEACE with his brother
- V. Encounter with GOD (Gen. 32:21b-32)
  - A. Jacob moved his FAMILY to SAFETY
  - B. Jacob retired alone to PRAY
  - C. Jacob encountered God PERSONALLY
    - 1. Jacob learns PERSISTANCE in PRAYER
    - 2. Jacob learns PERSEVERANCE through PAIN
    - 3. Jacob gets a new name identifying him as "God's VICTOR"
    - 4. Jacob believes he will SURVIVE meeting Esau
    - 5. Jacob has taken POSSESSION of God's PROMISE
- VI. Lessons
  - A. God is always PRESENT to HELP us
  - B. That does not RELIEVE us of our RESPONSIBILITIES
  - C. We learn how to be a PEACEMAKER
  - D. We learn PERSEVERANCE in PRAYER
