PREDICTING THE DISCIPLES' FAILURE AND RESTORATION (Matthew 26:31-35)

- I. Demonstrating Jesus' OMNISCIENCE (Matt. 26:31-32)
 - A. The dire PREDICTION (26:31)
 - 1. Jesus KNEW what would happen to HIM (31*b*; cf. 26:2, 12, 26-29)
 - a. He was the SHEPHERD who would be STRUCK DOWN (cf. Zech. 13:7)
 - b. The "FLOCK" would be SCATTERED
 - 1) Broadly, referred to the DISPERSAL of ISRAEL after AD 70
 - 2) Specifically, referred to the FLEEING of the DISCIPLES at Jesus' ARREST (cf. Mark 14:50)
 - 2. Jesus KNEW how His DISCIPLES would REACT (31*a*)
 - a. He would be ABANDONED by ALL OF THEM
 - b. It would happen THAT NIGHT
 - B. The divine PROMISE (26:32)
 - 1. He would RISE from the DEAD
 - 2. He would MEET THEM in GALILEE (cf. 28:7)

- a. Implies the BREVITY of their FAILURE and SEPARATION
- b. Implies FORGIVENESS for FORSAKING Him
- c. Implies RESTORATION to FELLOWSHIP with Him
- II. Declaring the Disciples' WEAKNESS (Matt. 26:33-35)
 - A. Their UNFOUNDED CONFIDENCE
 - 1. Peter arrogantly DECLARED that Jesus was WRONG
 - 2. They all AFFIRMED they'd DIE with Him before DENYING Him
 - B. The UNHAPPY REALITY
 - 1. The others would DISTANCE themselves from Him
 - 2. Peter would DENY Him THREE TIMES that night
- III. Displaying Jesus' SOVEREIGN GLORY
 - A. Their IMPOTENCE magnified Jesus' POWER
 - B. Their FAITHLESSNESS magnified Jesus' FAITHFULNESS
 - C. Their DISHONOR magnified Jesus' MAJESTY
