WHAT WILL YOU DO WITH JESUS? (Matthew 27:11-26)

I. The SANHEDRIN Wanted a CONVICTION (Matthew 27:2, 11-12)

- A. INDICTED before Pilate (27:2, 11*a*; cf. Luke 23:2)
 - 1. They accused Him of SUBVERTING the nation
 - 2. They accused Him of opposing the PAYMENT of TAXES to Caesar
 - 3. They accused of claiming to be CHRIST, a KING

B. INTERVIEWED/INTERROGATED by Pilate (27:11*b*-15)

- 1. Pilate asked Jesus, "Are YOU the KING of the Jews?"
- 2. Jesus answered, "YOU said it"
- 3. Pilate asked if He would RESPOND to the OTHER charges
- 4. Jesus remained SILENT
- 5. Pilate was IMPRESSED by Jesus' SILENCE

II. The GOVERNOR Recommended CLEMENCY (Matt. 27:15-23)

- A. The CUSTOM (27:15)
 - 1. He annually PARDONED one PRISONER

- 2. He allowed the PEOPLE to CHOOSE which one
- B. The CRIMINAL (27:16)
 - 1. He was named BARABBAS
 - 2. He was charged with leading an INSURRECTION
- C. The CHOICE (27:17-18)
 - 1. Pilate offered to release "the KING of the JEWS"
 - 2. He knew Jesus had been ACCUSED out of ENVY
- D. The CAUTION (27:19)
 - 1. Pilate's WIFE warned him to AVOID involvement
 - 2. She AFFIRMED Jesus' INNOCENCE
- E. The CONDEMNATION (27:20-23)
 - The chief priests and elders convinced the CROWD to demand BARABBAS
 - 2. Pilate asked what they DESIRED for JESUS
 - 3. The crowd DEMANDED Jesus be CRUCIFIED
 - 4. Pilate asked for what CRIME He should be EXECUTED
 - 5. The crowd's DEMAND became FRENZIED
 - 6. Jesus was CONDEMNED to PACIFY the crowd
